I KNOW GENDER 17: **GENDER EQUALITY** AND ORGANIZED CRIME

The latest I Know Gender module, developed by the **UN Women Training Centre** and UNODC, promotes the integration of a gender equality perspective in the work of stakeholders counteracting organized crime



GENDER-RESPONSIVE BUDGETING (GRB)

This course strenghthens understandings of the relationship between gender-responsive budgeting, gender equality, human rights, human development and good governance



GENDER EQUALITY AND MACROECONOMICS

This course, in collaboration wih the IMF, introduced participants in the West Balkans, Morocco and Equatorial Guinea to gender in economic policies, analysis, budgeting, poverty and unemployment-related issues



WORKING PAPER ON ONLINE TRAINING AND FEMINIST PEDAGOGIES


Online training has become the predominant modality for delivering training for gender equality worldwide since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The UN Women Training Centre's new working paper explores the implications of this shift to online learning from the perspective of feminist pedagogical principles and practices. It sheds light on how to make online training for gender equality a truly transformative process in the context of online training, based on the UN Women Training Centre's participatory research and discussions with trainers. While online training offers exciting opportunities and trainers are adapting to new conditions, there remain challenges to converting this energy and innovation into long-lasting change for gender equality.


VIRTUAL DIALOGUE WEBINAR REPORTS




TRAINING CENTRE'S GROWTH 2014-2022













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
